Who is a veteran?

In Australia, a veteran is defined as any person who has served for at least one day in the Australian Defence Force (ADF). This includes permanent personnel in the Navy, Army and Air Force, as well as Reservists.

Veterans can be categorised as 'currently serving' or 'ex-serving'.

The Australian Government also often recognises ex-serving members living in Australia from Commonwealth and other Allied countries, such as the United Kingdom, New Zealand, Canada and South Africa.

Problem Solving

ADF members use their knowledge, available evidence and situational awareness to address issues and take a solution-focused and results-driven approach to problem-solving.

Communication

Veterans can identify, articulate and share relevant information using well-developed communication skills.

Planning and Evaluation

Veterans take a methodical approach to planning and evaluation.

Teamwork

As serving ADF members, veterans become part of tight-knit teams in which success depends on every member of the team playing their part. This means ex-serving veterans have experience in collaborating towards a shared goal.

Leadership

At all levels of the ADF, members are expected to show leadership through delegating, motivating teams and delivering results.
